most common occurring symptoms:



DRY COUGH



TIREDESS



FEVER $>37,5^{\circ}\text{C}$

less common symptoms:

muscle pain; sore throat; diarrhea; conjunctivitis; headache; loss of taste or smell; skin rash or discoloration of the fingers and toes

serious symptoms:

breathing difficulty or shortness of breath; chest pain or breathlessness; loss of speech or motor skills

What should I do when I suspect a coronavirus infection?

A student is obliged to immediately inform the head of the appropriate University unit – their place of study – via phone, or via e-mail, about suspected SARS-CoV-2 infection. **Even if you are unsure but have symptoms of infection, in last 10 days had contact with person with symptoms or positive test result or are quarantined – you must notify the University.** The best is to contact your *Dean's Office*, *Coordinator of your studies* and *International Office* at once – they will forward your report to special unit of the University which is responsible for investigating and controlling cases with a possible coronavirus disease. All information with contact data for foreign students is available on the University website, websites of Faculties and website of International Office. Please be sure to separate yourself from other people immediately to stop spreading the virus and contact District Sanitary and Epidemiological Station in Wrocław. Don't go there in person – it is best to call their helpline or write them an email with your contact data so they will be able to contact you back. Next follow the instructions of the Station's staff or persons manning the helpline.

CORONAVIRUS helpline is available Monday to Friday between 7:30 AM and 8 PM

If the **condition** of the person showing the symptoms of SARS-CoV-2 infection **worsens**, one should **call an ambulance** in order to transport the individual to the nearest infectious diseases ward, and immediately report the event to the District Sanitary and Epidemiological Station. Do not try to go to hospital by bus or taxi – care about safety of others. Do not hold on information about your symptoms if you will be asked by ambulance dispatcher about them.

How to be sure that it is not just a cold?
